Hiking the John Muir Trail

January

Sara Cockrell will share her backpacking adventures on the 211+ mile John Muir Trail in the High Sierras, from Yosemite National Park to the top of Mt. Whitney at 14,484 feet. She hiked through three National Parks: Yosemite, Kings Canyon and Sequoia, and two wilderness areas: the John Muir and the Ansel Adams, and through Devils Postpile National Monument and the Inyo National Forest. She shared the route with thru-hikers on the Pacific Crest Trail. In addition to the ever-changing landscape, what makes this journey one of the premier hiking destinations (for the day, a weekend or a month), is that it is roadless and blessed with the mildest sunniest climate of any major



mountain range in the world. The Sierra Nevada is one of the most striking escarpments in the US with 12,000-14,000 foot soaring granite peaks, sculpted cirques and hanging valleys. Thirteen river drainages form 5000 foot deep canyons, cascading waterfalls and aquamarine tarns by the thousands. She walked among giant, ancient trees and through meadows

Director's Column

Output vs Outcome: It is all about Literacy

As your new library director I have been gladly reporting on the steadily increasing utilization of the library as demonstrated by circulation transactions. This past September, the library experienced 25% higher circulation than in September of 2009; in October 2010, circulation was 15% higher than circulation in October 2009; and in November, circulation was 26% higher than November of 2009. Wow. But a question to be posed could be – "So What?" How does this translate to the value of Traverse Area District Library to the community it serves. We know it says something about the community, but what does it say about the library?

In the last year I have been approached by no fewer than three non-profit agencies that focus on literacy. This demonstrates a compelling interest in literacy as a core value. This interest is underpinned by research documenting that reading to your children, encouraging your children to read, the modeling that adults provide by reading themselves and by just having reading matter around the home all contribute to the success of individuals in school and in their careers and the success of a community as a whole.

This is why, in addition to providing open access lending collections of literature on all levels, libraries have always

sponsored "story time" for young children, book clubs for teens and adults and now sponsor whole community reading events such as TC Reads, which brought Mary Doria Russell to Traverse City this Fall.

Just as important is information literacy and computer literacy. Have you noticed that nearly all governmental agencies are distributing information online and requiring citizens to request government services online? What if you had been working in a manufacturing facility all of your life and had never properly learned to use a computer? Now imagine, with no or few computers skills and likely no high speed internet and certainly no fancy new computer at home, you have been laid off? Your public library is there – not just with high speed internet and good quality computers but with knowledgeable and helpful employees to steer you though the initial maze to file for unemployment, apply for a job or find out how to compose that power cover letter.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve Grand Traverse County from six terrific public libraries. Keep your comments and suggestions coming!
