As we enter 2025, let's commit to being people whose words and actions reflect the life-giving truth of Jesus Christ. May we be attentive to God's voice, courageous in following His call, and intentional in how we speak and live each day.

YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

We received three thank-you notes from these organizations, highlighting just a few of the ways we made an impact this year!

The Second Mile Center

In May, we partnered with The Second Mile Center to support their community dinner event at Buffalo Wild Wings, as well as a fundraiser at Copper Hop. Our involvement with this organization helps address food insecurity and provide educational opportunities for children in our community, all rooted in God's love. These children face significant challenges, and our contributions make a lasting impact, not only in their daily lives but also in shaping brighter futures for them.

World Vision

During VBS in August, our VBS families raised \$330 for World Vision, a nonprofit dedicated to addressing the root causes of poverty and injustice. Through their holistic approach, they work to create brighter futures for children and families in need. In a show of support, our church matched this amount, contributing a total of \$660 to this impactful organization.

Hope Build

Macomb County Habitat for Humanity is a Michigan-based nonprofit focused on building affordable homes for lowincome families, helping them break the cycle of poverty through homeownership. By partnering with volunteers, donors, and the Habitat ReStore, they provide families with the strength, stability, and self-reliance needed to build better lives.

In honor of Dave Tirsell, who served as our church liaison for this important organization, our church made a donation to support Habitat for Humanity's mission.



Christmas Gift Tree

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who participated in the Christmas Gift Tree. Through your generosity, 10 families (37 children) from our community, as well as 25 children from the Second Mile Center, received Christmas gifts. Each of the 10 families also received a holiday dinner basket and a food gift card. Your kindness brought Christmas joy to so many in need.

Clothes Closet/Food Pantry

In November, we served 228 families (703 individuals), and our dedicated volunteers worked 128.25 hours. If you're able to donate food items, we're in need of some pantry staples: chicken noodle soup, tomato soup, tuna, peanut butter, jelly, Spaghettios, noodles, cereal, and canned vegetables. Many of the guests who visit the food pantry live in temporary housing with limited cooking facilities, so basic, easy-toprepare meal items are especially helpful.

Our Clothes Closet volunteers have been working tirelessly to organize and distribute donations. To make their job easier, please remember to donate only clean, current-season, smoke-free clothing.

On Monday December 9th, we had several families in need. One woman, who spoke no English, came with an interpreter. She had fled the war in Ukraine and was overwhelmed with emotion when she left our pantry with three bags of groceries, meat, and cheese. She expressed deep gratitude, sharing that she had visited other pantries but never returned because she felt treated poorly. She thanked us through her friend, saying how much it meant that we made her feel welcomed and cared for.

Thanks to the support of our church family, we are able to make a real difference in the lives of those struggling with food insecurity. We are so grateful for your ongoing contributions to the food pantry and Clothes Closet.
